

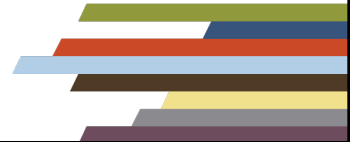

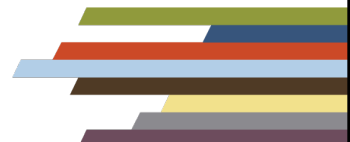

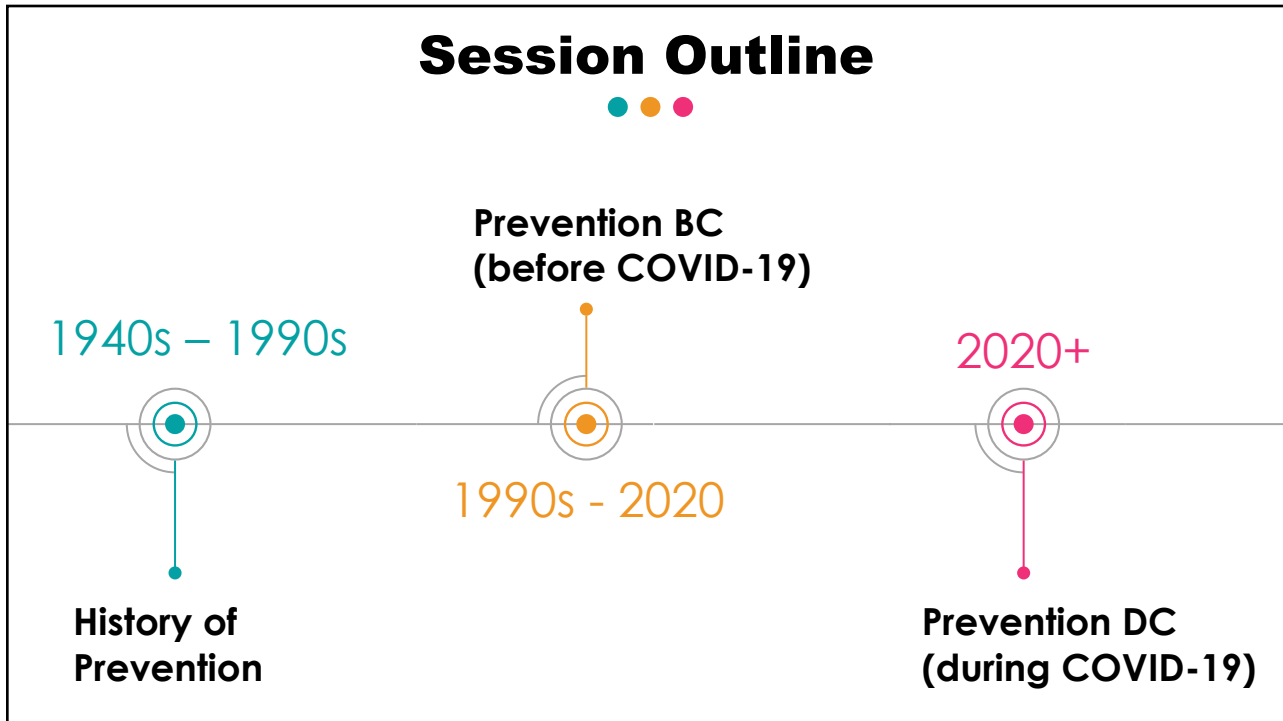

Marijuana became illegal 1937

WW II increased tobacco and drug use

Creation of National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence & EAP programs

National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH)

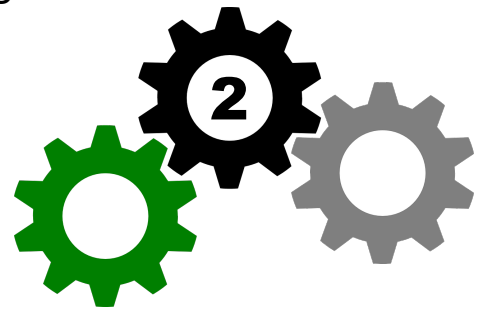

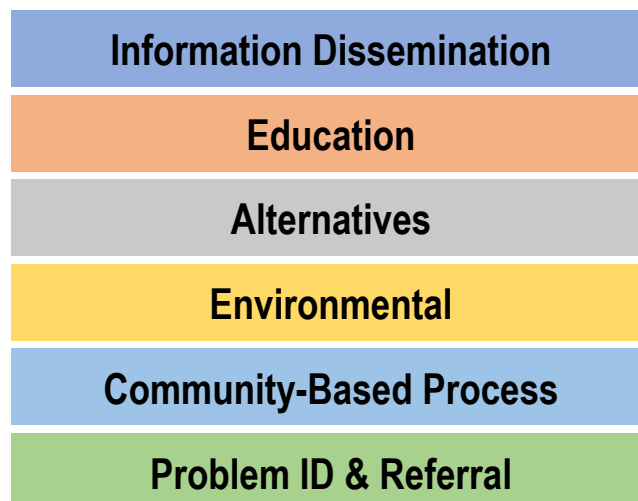

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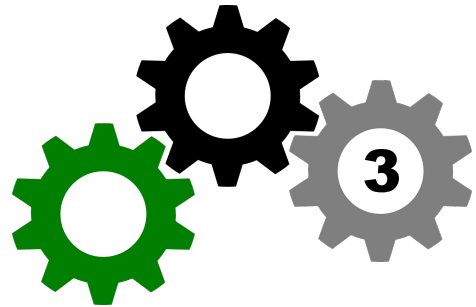
