






History of Prevention Where We've Been

Alcohol

Alcoholism movement

Drugs & Tobacco

Marijuana became illegal 1937

WW II increased tobacco and drug use

Prevention

Creation of National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence & EAP programs

National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH)

1940s

Drugs & Alcohol

Heroin use all-time high Narcotic Control Act 1956

Tobacco

Smoking linked to lung cancer

Prevention

Scare tactics through film and speakers
First edition of the DSM released

Drugs & Alcohol

Culture of drug use for psychedelic experience LSD became illegal in 1967

First Report on Smoking and Health – Surgeon General

Scare tactics continued


